Having time to just let your mind get recharged for a few days is always a good endeavor and provides the opportunity to reflect on the past and look forward to the future with confidence and enthusiasm whether it be your daily walk of life or any other situations that require your attention and support.

Well brethren we are about to embark upon another masonic year, Grand Lodge was very exciting from my prospective and I hope those who attended had a memorable experience that will benefit your masonic journey and perhaps some information that will assist your lodge in the days before us.

Some items noted:

- Past Master's Course -the requirements for eligibility to become District Deputy Grand Master now requires you to complete Modules 7, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 18.. If you think you are interested in allowing your name stand for DDGM I think you should start as soon as your place in life permits. The ideal situation in my opinion is register immediately and complete one module a month for six months and your course would be completed by April without a whole amount of stress as we have experienced in the past trying to qualify two or three months before Grand Lodge. A Constitutional amendment that qualifies for the certificate of completion that will be required by June 15th of the year you are planning to be elected DDGM.
- Grand Lodge is going out on the road again with Seminars and Workshops. This provides an opportunity for masons to receive information and education personally other than attending Grand Lodge
- Members and lodges to assist with contributions to the Grand Master's Project PROSTATE CANCER RESEARCH. It is our hope to raise ONE MILLION DOLLARS that is directed to three researchers in London Hamilton and Kingston

Brief History

Upon the death of M. W. Bro. John Ross Robertson, Grand Master from 1890-1891, in 1918 a very fine collection of over



1,000 volumes of Craft literature was bequeathed to Grand Lodge. This collection formed the core of the Grand Lodge Library established in 1931 and administered by a special committee. Its first report to the Grand Lodge of its

stewardship was presented in 1932. In 1937, a Library Committee was set-up as a sub-committee of the Board of General Purposes.

The Library was originally located in the Masonic Temple at 888 Yonge Street in Toronto. In February 1985, under the chairmanship of R. W. Bro. Wayne Elgie, the Library was moved to Hamilton and located in the lower level of the Grand Lodge Memorial Building at 363 King Street West. In May 1995, the Library was moved from the lower level to the second floor. Also at that time, M. W. Bro. C. Edwin Drew dedicated the second floor of the Memorial Building as a Museum. That same year, under the chairmanship of R. W. Bro. Frank Dunn, the Library, Museum and Archives Committee became a reality. This structure remains in place to this day.
