FROM THE GRAND MASTER

Greetings, Brethren:



In my message last month, I stressed the importance of making informed decisions when you vote for candidates for Grand Lodge Office. important is Equally decision that each of us makes as a Lodge member when we elect or appoint the junior officer in our Lodges. This is the member who will in all likelihood become your Master One of some dav. distressing things I hear all too

often is a situation where, for whatever reason, the Brethren become dissatisfied with an officer the closer he comes to assuming the Master's chair. My Brethren, our system of government is based on a steady progression through a number of stations in the Lodge. With each of these stations comes not only responsibility but accountability.

And, in some cases, even more significantly, expectations. Expectations on both sides – expectations of the membership, including the Past Masters, and expectations of the Officers progressing on their journey.

In most cases, any conflicts that arise are related to failure to meet expectations. I encourage the members of each lodge to engage in frank, open discussion about the expectations that you place on your Officers, from the Master on down. But, as members of the Lodge, you must also understand the expectations of the Brethren you elect or appoint. No officer can deliver against unknown expectations. No Lodge member can be dissatisfied with performance if his expectations of performance were not made known. It is indeed a two way street. Get to know your officers. The future of your Lodge depends upon it.

In a similar manner, do we make known to our candidates for Grand Lodge Office what we expect of them? In the months leading up to Grand Lodge, do we take the time to ascertain what their expectations are? My Brethren, the candidate sheets are out in the hands of every Lodge Secretary. Information will soon be published on the Grand Lodge website. I encourage you to get to know these Brethren and make an informed decision in July. The future of your Grand Lodge depends on it.

Brethren, part of our **Grand Lodge Mission** statement is to provide effective and sustainable leadership to Ontario's Masonic community. Putting capable and qualified leaders in place in our Lodges forms the nucleus of the talent pool on which your Grand Lodge draws from to fulfill its Mission.

Housekeeping Items

Installation Teams – Please remind those taking part in Installations that there is to be only one book open in Lodge and that is the one used by the designated sponsor. No other copies of the Ceremony of Installation are to be open in Lodge and no other Brethren should issue prompts.

Looking Ahead

I quote from our strategic Plan: Freemasonry's timeless lessons, from their simple clarity to their sublime interpretation, may have never been more applicable to the lives of men as we believe they are today.

We are experiencing a tremendous resurgence in Freemasonry in Ontario. The lists of applicants and candidates awaiting degrees is prevalent in many, many of our summons.

I perceive that many of our new Masons are indeed seeking out the lessons of our fraternity because of what they are not finding in the working world today. Those timeless lessons learned on the floor of the Lodge, the application of those lessons through the effective employment of our working tools, and our belief in a growing, exciting future in our jurisdiction will no doubt ensure the timeless vitality of Freemasonry in Ontario.

It is not enough to simply be working hard; we must be working hard at meaningful tasks that contribute to the overall health of this great fraternity!

FROM THE DEPUTY GRAND MASTER

The **Grand Master's Banquet** will be held on **Wednesday**, **July 18**, **2012**; doors will be open at 6:00 p.m. Dinner will start promptly at **6:30 p.m.** Lodges may reserve a table for 8. Selection of reserved tables are made on a first come, first served basis. If you are reserving a table, please do not include any of the Elected, Appointed or Honorary Members of the Board. Those Members of the Board have assigned seating. Tickets for the Grand Master's Banquet are \$58 each and must be purchased through you the D.D.G.M.

District Meeting

Each District has been assigned a TIME and ROOM to hold their meeting. It is the responsibility of the D.D.G.M. to preside over the District Meeting. The first order of business shall be the election of the D.D.G.M. All ballots at the District Meeting, regardless of colour, count as one vote only. The new D.D.G.M. shall be elected by a majority of the votes cast by the Masters, Past Masters and Wardens of the lodges of such district. If a second ballot is required, only those brethren who have placed first or second on the first ballot shall be

eligible as candidates for the second ballot. The D.D.G.M. shall ensure his successor is eligible for the office of D.D.G.M., as per the Book of Constitution 50(b), before the Grand Master will confirm their election. All ballot papers cast shall be retained and forwarded (preferably in a sealed, marked envelope) to the Grand Secretary, as per Section 66 of the Book of Constitution.

Fairmont Royal York Hotel

You have to remember that we are not the only conference or function being held at the hotel. All delegates and brethren, who are planning on reserving a room at the Royal York, should do so as soon as possible. The Grand Secretary had made arrangements with the hotel to hold a number of room nights for "Masons" who are only guaranteed until June 1st. Don't be disappointed and book your room(s) now. All brethren who are making room reservations please advise the receptionist, you are part of the "Masonic Group."

Meet the Candidates

We have a number of candidates who have been nominated for Grand Senior Warden (3), Grand Junior Warden (2), Grand Registrar (4) and the Board of General Purposes (15). You will have an opportunity to meet the nominees on Tuesday, July 17, 2012, between 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in Salon A on the Convention Floor at the Fairmont Royal York Hotel. Delegates, if you have the time, stop in and meet them.

Seminars

On Tuesday, July 17, from 1:30 p.m. to 4:20 p.m., the Committee on Seminars and Workshops will be presenting five seminars for all brethren. See the opposite column of this issue for a complete time-table.

Voting

Past Masters, Masters and Wardens are to be reminded that voting for Grand Lodge Officers, except for the D.D.G.M., will take place on Tuesday evening from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and on Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Concert Hall. Balloting for Grand Lodge Officers is done at the time of registration. Masters, Wardens and Proxy holders should be familiar with Sections 56 and 57 of the Book of Constitution. A lodge that has properly made their Returns to Grand Lodge are entitled to three votes to be cast by the Master and Wardens if present. If any one of them be absent his vote shall be given to the senior officer (of the three present). Only if all three (Master and Wardens) are absent, the three votes may be cast by the Proxy delegated by the lodge. If a lodge fails to make their Return on or before July 8, Section 57, Constitution of Grand Lodge must be implemented.

The Camp Trillium Spirit is captured in its Core Values: Fun: Is what Camp Trillium does and how we do it – creating memories which last a lifetime through laughter and friendship People: Our enthusiastic campers, dedicated staff and committed volunteers and generous supporters are the Camp Trillium Family Care: Camp Trillium embraces campers and their families with care in a safe and healing environment Innovation: Through innovative approaches, Camp Trillium provides a camping opportunity that encourages inclusiveness, creativity, personal growth and achievement.

Camp Trillium is a leader in oncology camping programs. Year round in the province of Ontario 56 programs are provided for children living with cancer and their families and in 2010, over 3,100 campers participated in residential and family camps as well as 8 week Day Camps held across the province.

Camp Trillium is the largest provider of recreational programs for children living with cancer in North America and is the lead association in the development of oncology camping policy and procedures templates in use in most camps in Canada. Camp Trillium is a place where children afflicted with cancer can enjoy what many take for granted... fun, friendships, and a respite from hospitals and treatment, but most importantly the chance to be normal.

Camp Trillium is unfortunately no longer funded by the Canadian Cancer Society, Ontario Division because it no longer falls into their mandate to focus on Cancer research. - W. Bro. Edward Patterson, Chairman of the Hamilton Masonic District C 1st Annual BBQ will be held at the Holy Trinity/Serbian Community Centre on Saturday, June 23, 2012.
- **R. W. Bro. Eduardo Cordero , Co-chair** of the **Blood Donors Committee,** reported that this committee has seen growth in several areas and has had a most successful year. He needs help from more volunteers to help run the clinics.
- **R. W. Bro. John L. MacPherson**, Chairman of the **Masonic Foundation of Ontario Committee** commended the D.D.G.M. for bringing "Autism Ontario -Hamilton-Wentworth Chapter" project to the attention of the brethren of the District and thanked those who have supported this project.
- W. Bro. David Wilkinson, MasoniChip Regional Co-ordinator, Chair of the MasoniChip Committee reported that the annual Ancaster Fair operation is scheduled to run as usual, It will run on Saturday, September 22 and Sunday, September 23 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day and is being co-hosted by Landmarks/Doric No. 654 and St Andrews No. 593. Contact Bro. Doug Pollard of Landmarks/Doric, if you can help on either of these days.
- **Bro. Devin Tuinstra**, Chairman of the **Communications Committee**, reported that communications within our District appear to have reached a mature and steady state. Our District Website is continually being updated, and the secretaries of the lodges of the district are doing a great job maintaining their respective areas.

Some interesting observations he has made include:

- We receive just over 1000 unique visitors per month to our district website, (an increase of 30% over last year);
- The average unique visitor visits the website 1 to 2 times per month;
- The average user on the website visits 5 to 6 pages before leaving;
- We receive over 40,000 requests on our servers each month by Search Engines, which are indexing our content for their search results.

Out of all areas of the website, the Trestle Board is the most popular, followed by the Obituaries, Lodge Details, Past DDGMs, and then the District 'C'hronicle page.

W. Bro. Harley Auty, Editor of the Hamilton Masonic District C Newsletter - The 'C'hronicle, thanked the brethren of the District for their support. Thanks, too, were extended to the D.D.G.M. (R. W. Bro. John K. Johnston), the Associate Editor (R. W. Bro. Bill MacPherson), the District Photographer (V. W. Bro. John Lyness) and the Webmaster (Bro. Devin Tuinstra) for their significant contributions each month in publishing the newsletter.

It was announced that with regret the name of R. W. Bro. Wayne Elgie will be removed from the list of Chronicle Team Members as of the June edition. Centennial Daylight Lodge

A.F. & A.M. No. 679 G.R.C. Hamilton District "C"



Instituted: Niagara Falls, 1954 Relocated: Hamilton, 1990

On June 16, 1988, three masons -R. W. Bro. John De Young, V. W. Bro. Walter Simpson and W. Bro. Melvin Devins met to discuss the subject of a Daylight Lodge for the city of Hamilton.

The first topic was to increase the size of the committee to include R. W. Bro. James Curtis, W. Bro. James Bramley, W. Bro. David Dawson and W. Bro. Thomas Pocock. By August 24, 1988, they had a meeting with the Grand Secretary, M. W. Bro. Robert Davies, and were told another group was attempting to form a Daylight Lodge and that they had first call on the idea. Our committee waited until May 17, 1989, before we could send in a petition to the Grand Master showing that arrangements had been made regarding the meeting place in the Central Masonic Temple, the printing of notices and the equipment of the Lodge to get started.

On October 4, 1990, a letter to meet with the Grand Secretary gave the news that a Lodge in Niagara was handing in its charter and if our committee would agree to accept that charter and Lodge name we were in business. The proposal was accepted and Centennial No. 679 would become Centennial Daylight No. 679 in Hamilton on December 11, 1990, in the Central Masonic Temple, Main Street East, Hamilton.

The inaugural meeting would have the Grand Master, M. W. Bro. David Bradley, the Deputy Grand Master, R. W. Bro. Norman Byrne, Grand Secretary, M. W. Bro. Robert Davies and other Grand Dignitaries in attendance and V. W. Bro. Joseph Hobson as Installing Master.
