If you were unable to attend one of the sessions offered by the Lodge of Instruction team, remember your District Deputy Grand Master may grant dispensation for holding a Lodge of Instruction (Section 102 Book of Constitution). The performance of our Ritual and perfecting the Mechanics of the Work makes our institution unique.”

“Brethren in the last Communique one of my comments was poorly worded and may have caused some confusion about a brother qualifying to be a eligible candidate to run for DDGM. For those brethren who are currently registered in the old course and have not completed it, they must complete all the assignments in the old course by December 31st, 2013 and have them submitted to the College, otherwise they will have to go through the system. Those brethren who have successfully completed the former DDGM course are qualified to run for DDGM or GRAND REGISTRAR at any time without any updating. Once you have earned your certificate from the College

you have it for life. I apologize for any confusion. The Grand Master has extended this date to December 31, 2013 for the benefit of those brethren who first showed early interest in this program.”

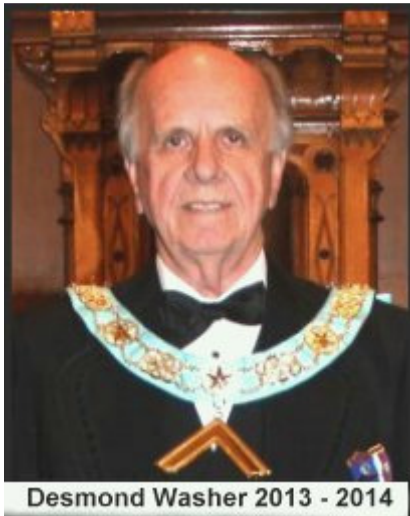

**Worshipful Master
W. Bro. Desmond Washer**



Very Worshipful Brother Desmond Washer was born in Derby, England, whose claims to fame are the Rolls Royce and Royal Crown Derby China. Desmond served throughout the Sixties for twelve years in Her Majesty's Royal Air Force in the Middle and Far East. He was Initiated into Freemasonry in Singapore July 1966, in Sir Stamford Raffles Lodge No. 7444, under the English Constitution.

He immigrated to Canada in the October of 1968 and affiliated with The Electric Lodge No. 495 in the march of 1969. He was first placed in the Chair of King Solomon in January of 1975. He was appointed to the Grand Lodge rank of Past Assistant Grand Secretary in 1992. He served as the Secretary for the Electric Lodge for 20 years from 1989 to 2009, the year of the 100th celebration. He is currently serving as the Hamilton District C Historian.

His philosophy on Freemasonry is fairly simple. Be as good as you can be to your fellow human beings. Walk a steady path through life; doing the right thing, with no harm to others. Serve rather than be served and, always try to see the big picture rather than the minutiae of life.
